Ontario Reminds Young Workers to Stay Safe This Summer [12]

Province Helping young People to Know their Rights at Work

With the summer job season gearing up, Ontario is reminding young workers - and their employers and supervisors - that they have rights and responsibilities at work under the law.

More than 1.5 million young people aged 15 to 24 work across Ontario, and every year more than 6,000 are injured seriously enough to need time off work.

By law, all workers including young workers, have the right to:

- Refuse unsafe work
- Know about hazards in the workplace and how to protect their health and safety
- Participate in resolving workplace health and safety concerns

Young workers are also entitled to minimum standards under the Employment Standards Act, which include:

- Limits to the number of hours they can be required to work or allowed to work
- A certain number of hours free from work
- An eating period
- A regular pay period and payday

Quick Facts

- Every summer, the Ministry of Labour conducts a young worker health and safety blitz [15] to make sure all workers know their rights - this year's four-month blitz began in May.
- Between 2009 and 2013, 30 young workers aged 15 to 24 died in work-related incidents and more than 30,000 received injuries resulting in lost time at work.
- New and young workers are three times more likely to be injured during their first month of work than at any other time.
